DUAL BACHELOR OF SCIENCE WITH A MAJOR IN CHEMISTRY AND MASTER OF FORENSIC SCIENCES WITH A CONCENTRATION IN FORENSIC CHEMISTRY

The Department of Chemistry offers a dual bachelor of science with a major in chemistry (http://bulletin.gwu.edu/arts-sciences/chemistry/bs/) and master of forensic sciences with a concentration in forensic chemistry (http://bulletin.gwu.edu/arts-sciences/forensic-sciences/mfs-forensic-chemistry/) degree program. The program allows students to take 12 graduate credits as part of their undergraduate program, thereby decreasing the number of credits normally required for the master's degree. All requirements for both degrees must be fulfilled.
